This choir was established over 100 years ago and is considered to be the best collegiate a cappella choir.

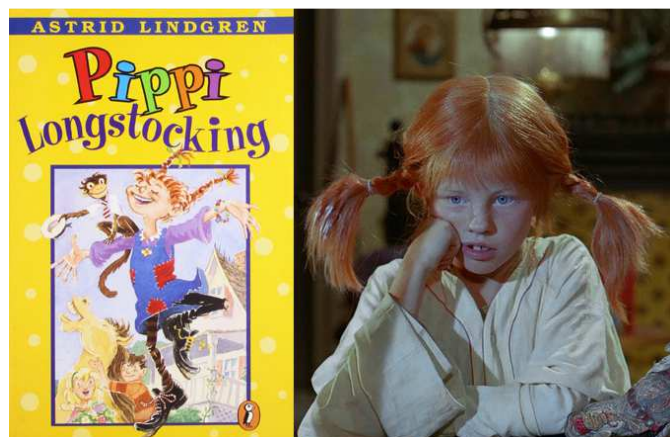
The Cathedral is at 325 W 8th St in downtown Cincinnati. It faces Plum St. There is a parking lot just to the south of the Cathedral.

Dayton International Festival

The Dayton Festival is our lodge's biggest fundraiser of the year.

Tubfrim

Tubfrim is an organization in Norway that resells cancelled stamps and donates the proceeds to help fight tuberculosis. The Sons of Norway is proud to support Tubfrim in their work to support children in need.



In 1928 Ditlef Frantzen, postmaster of the small Norwegian town of Nesbyen, got the idea to collect and market canceled stamps as a way of raising funds for the Tuberculosis Association in Norway. Within a few years, his idea caught on and many communities in Norway and beyond were collecting and sending bags of canceled stamps to Nesbyen. When Frantzen left Nesbyen in 1943, he donated his stamp collecting institution to the Norwegian Health Service. Since tuberculosis is no longer the threat to health that it once was, today disabled and needy children receive the proceeds from the resale of the stamps.

To help Tubfrim do its crucial work, simply clip canceled stamps from envelopes, leaving at least a quarter of an inch around the edge. Please take time to cut the stamps properly. Stamps cannot be used if they are torn, have extra layers of envelope behind them, are on a string of multiple stamps (i.e. 3 stamps in a row without the spacing), or non-profit or bulk stamps. Stamps can be from any country and all styles of stamps will be accepted. Forever stamps are also acceptable. If envelopes or postcards are over 40-50 years old, send the whole envelope or postcard. They also will use old phone cards.

Bring your stamps to a lodge meeting and give to Esther Charlton.
