August Lodge Meeting Saturday, August 16



Two Norwegians are behind the world's smallest computer

Norwegian TV moguls Stig Eide Sivertsen and Hein Espen Hattestad are going to take on the world using a computer weighing less than an ounce.

Finansavisen reports that Sivertsen and Hattestad have backed Norwegian technology company FXI Technologies with 5.25 million kroner to bring the world's smallest computer to the mass market.

A year ago FXI Technologies started sales of the mini-computer Cotton Candy, which weighs less than an ounce and at just over 3 inches, is about the size of a thumbdrive. According to Finansavisen it plugs into any free-standing monitor or TV to function as a full-fledged computer. FXI Technologies published a video to explain how their "Any Screen Microcomputer" fits into the user's technology needs.

"When two TV people like us get into this, you understand that we think this is very interesting," Stig Eide Sivertsen told Finansavisen. Sivertsen joins as a smaller investor and is chairman of the board, while Hattestad's company Exoid Ventrue enters with 5.25 million crowns that will be issued to the company in 3 installments. The current net worth of the company is estimated at ten million crowns (\$1.66 million)

Sivertsen and Hattestad know each other well from the time that they were top managers of Norway's major television distributors. Hattestad was Head of Viasat for many years, while Sivertsen led competitor Canal Digital via the holding company

Telenor Broadcast. The two battled for years over customers of satellite television, but also worked together during the large channel switch with channels TV3 and TV2 in the mid-2000s.

LAPTOP magazine published a review of the FXI Cotton Candy, calling it "not just a[n] intriguing mobile device but the beginnings of a powerful new platform."
