#### **World Choir Games**

The Games held here in Cincinnati July 4-14, are called "the Olympics of choral music". There were over 360 choirs from 64 countries here in Cincinnati. The "Big Pigs" were revived for the event. They were everywhere downtown.

As there were two choirs coming from Norway, there was a need to have choir hosts for them A big THANK YOU to lodge members Jean Crocker-Lakness, Tim & Connie Holmen, Teresa Lowen and Kristin Szava, who gave their time, to volunteer as choir hosts.

The first week, the EDT choir from Hamar was

here. They are a choir of 30 young people from ages 14-30. They had been preparing for the World Choir Games for a year and a half. Their hard work paid off as they won gold in the two catagories in which they competed, Poplular Choral Music and Mixed Yourth Choirs.

Since the EDT Choir was to perform in a Friendship Concert with the Kentucky Symphony on July 7, the general manager of the symphony, Angela Williamson, and I decided to have a potluck picnic at Devou Park before the concert. The picnic was fun even with the weather at 104 degrees and the choir barely getting there in time to eat. Their performance schedule for the competition was way behind. The Friendship Concerts were one of the better features of the event.

The second choir here was the World Festival Choir. This choir was formed in 1984 and has sung at huge music festivals. The choir is unique in that they only come together for a music festival and rehearse for a few days before the festival. Singers can join this choir from all over the world and they are sent special rehearsal cassettes. One of the days at lunch I chatted with a woman that had been with the choir since it was organized. All in all it was a wonderful musical event for Cincinnati and all the International visitors
