Never before have so many Norwegians taken to rollerskiing. Sales have skyrocketed, special competitions have been held and the local ski association *Skiforeningen* offered courses in rollerskiing techniques for the first time this fall. They were all fully booked.

"Rollerskiing is a natural extension of *Skiforeningen's* activities," Mette Habberstad of the association told newspaper *Dagens Næringsliv (DN)* earlier this autumn.

Habberstad attributes the sudden popularity of rollerskiing to an upswing in cross-country skiing itself and a desire by many Norwegians to improve their technique, even though they allegedly were "born with skis." *Skiforeningen's* courses in general have enjoyed increased popularity in recent years. Norway has topped the list several times in recent years, after scoring highest in terms of such factors as life expectancy, earnings, education levels, the likelihood to be the victim of crime and equality between men and women.

Norwegians, according to the UN, can expect to live to age 81, have nearly 13 years of schooling on average and only 33 of every 100,000 are vulnerable to being affected by crime.
