Melting Snow in Norway Reveals Artifacts by Viking e-post



A recent discovery in the Trollheim and Dovre mountains in Norway revealed ancient artifacts, including arrows and a bow that were most likely used between 3,800 and 5,400 years ago by hunters to kill reindeer.

Discovered by Martin Callanan, an archaeologist at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology, Callanan spends his summers with colleagues in the mountains measuring the rate of snow melt and looking for recently upturned artifacts. It was during the summers of 2010 and 2011 that the bow and arrows were initially found and this September Callanan's study was published in Antiquity, a quarterly archaeology journal.

Well-preserved by the snow and ice, the bow and arrows are rare specimens that advance the study of archery technology during the Neolithic-period. The bow is made from a type of elm that is common along the coast, while the arrows were made from a variety of woods but all have tips made of slate.

"These are unique finds, they are a signal that something is changing up there. As snow patches

are starting to melt, people are finding archaeological artifacts in all sorts of different places and they are often quite well preserved," Martin Callanan told the BBC News last August.

Despite the academic value of the find, what is most concerning for archaeologists is the rate at which the snow is melting. The discovery of the bow and arrows are but a portion of the unprecedented number of artifacts found since the snow was first measured almost a century ago, indicating an increase in the rate at which the snow melts.

Climate change is a huge concern for archaeologists because the cold naturally preserves artifacts. Without the snow, artifacts could be exposed to the elements and be destroyed before they can be studied. "At the same time," Callanan told the BBC, "as the climate continues to heat up and the snows melt away, one wonders what long-term price there will be to pay for these glimpses of the frozen past."
